

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum until 2020 to provide new, substantial primary school sports funding. This funding is provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The funding is going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all of their children.

For the school year 2016/17, Carrwood Primary has been allocated the sum of £9,325 to spend on its P.E and sports provision, which will be used to continue to improve the quality of teaching and learning.

Some of this fund will be spent on the quality of teaching of pupils across the school by purchasing external coaches who will teach pupils specific sports and new approaches to learning in P.E. We have spent £1120 on a dance and gymnastics instructor who will provide lessons during and after the school day. This learning will be complimented by the purchase of additional equipment to enhance our extensive P.E provision and to be used in school clubs.

We are also broadening the range of activities by using forest schools to enhance our outdoor education development. We have spent £3,400 with the green man learning team to develop personal and physical attributes.

Learning will also improve in P.E by purchasing services from a Sports Improvement Partner, which aims to highlight the use of training into practice, to improve pupil achievement in P.E.

Carrwood will again be buying into the Leadership academy competitive sports partnership, which will see our pupils taking part in more local and national competitions. This currently totals £2800.

Social, moral and cultural ethos will be further embedded throughout both organised sports events and general physical exercise to develop sportsmanship and competitiveness.

The percentages of children participating in inter school sport will increase by a minimum of 5%.
