



P.E. and Sports Premium Intended Spend 2025 – 2026

The Government provides additional funding each year to schools to make additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of P.E. and sport for the benefit of all pupils. This funding is provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It is allocated directly to schools to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles and can only be used for this purpose.

Carrwood Primary School's allocation for 2025 -2026 is £18,170 with a carry-forward from the previous academic year of £0.

P.E. and Sport Premium Strategy: Sustainability

Our P.E. and Sport Premium strategy is designed with long-term sustainability in mind, ensuring that the impact of our investment continues to benefit pupils beyond the immediate funding period. The key ways we aim to make this strategy sustainable include:

Investment in staff professional development	By providing ongoing training for teachers and support staff in physical education and sport coaching. This will ensure that high quality P.E. lessons and extracurricular activities and this will provide staff with confidence and ensure for a lasting sustainable P.E. programme.
Focus on equipment and facilities	We will prioritise making sure we keep up to date with new sporting trends to ensure that children are not left behind within the sporting settings. We will purchase durable and versatile sporting equipment which will not only benefit our current pupils but those of the future.
Creating a school ethos with creating active school and children becoming physically active	We aim to create a school ethos on keeping children active in all areas of the curriculum not just P.E. Working closely with CAS we will embed a physical active policy which will promote a healthy understanding around how physical activity can help not just physical fitness but also create an deeper understand on social and mental health.
Collaboration with the other local after school provisions and working with JU:MP program	We are working with JU:MP community program that will eventually open up school to outside extra curricular providers and community centres. We would like Carrwood to be a central hub for the Holmewood estate where children and parents can access a safe sporting facilities venue which will help the community to respect the school and its grounds and give a positive impact on the community and school.
Developing a wider range of young sports leaders within the school	We currently offer young sports leaders programme but this could be extended and not just focus on one specific year group. The programme could be adapted for the current sports leaders to help train new younger leaders and will give children in the younger years positive role modes that are peer as well as adults.

By embedding these sustainable practices into our P.E. and Sport strategy, we aim to ensure that the benefits of this funding last well into the future, providing lasting positive outcomes for all pupils.
